PCSD Resolution No. 97-102

RESOLUTION FURTHER AMENDING THE AMENDED RULES AND
REGULATIONS IMPLEMENTING THE STRATEGIC ENVIRONMENTAL PLAN
FOR PALAWAN ACT

WHEREAS, the amended rules and regulations implementing the Strategic
Environmental Plan for Palawan Act was formulated and approved by the Council in 25
May 1993;

WHEREAS, in the PCSD meeting of December 5, 1996, the Council approved the
deletion of the phrase "which is not for profit" in Section 10, Number 2, Subsection b of
the above
cited PCSD Implementing Rules and Regulations;

NOW THEREFORE, upon motion of Cong. Abueg, Jr. duly seconded by Cong.
Vicente A. Sandoval; the Palawan Council for Sustainable Development hereby;

RESOLVED, as it is hereby Resolved to delete the phrase "which is not for profit"
in Section 10, Number 2, Subsection b of the amended rules and regulations implementing
the strategic environmental plan for Palawan Act, and for said subsection to now read as :

"b. Controlled Use Area - outer protective barrier that encircles the core and
restricted use areas. Strictly controlled mining and logging, almaciga tapping,

tourism development, research, grazing and gathering of honey, rattan and other minor forest products may be allowed. This shall include the:

- i. Altitude limit from 100-300 meters elevation.
- ii. Lower altitude limit can go up to 300 meters if it would not cause negative ecological impacts, but the high altitude limit shall not exceed 500 meters.
- iii. In areas where there is a community within or immediately adjacent to a restricted use area, a controlled use zone could be delineated from the restricted use area for use of the community."


RESOLVED, finally that copy of this Resolution be furnished to the Department of Environment and Natural Resources for information and guidance.

PCSD Resolution No. 96-10

A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A CEMENT PLANT, QUARRYING AND OTHER FACILITIES IN THE MUNICIPALITIES OF QUEZON AND ESPANOLA; TO AUTHORIZE THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENT AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO ISSUE THE NECESSARY CERTIFICATE OF ENVIRONMENTAL CLEARANCE; AND FOR THE PROPONENTS TO SUBMIT TO THE COUNCIL AN ENVIRONMENT IMPACT ASSESSMENT WITHIN 60 DAYS FROM RECEIPT THEREOF

WHEREAS, Republic Act 7611, known as the Strategic Environmental Plan (SEP) for Palawan Act, was approved and took effect on June 19, 1992 upon the signing into law by then President Corazon C. Aquino;

WHEREAS, the SEP is a comprehensive framework for the Sustainable Development of Palawan, compatible with protecting and enhancing the natural resources and endangered environment of the province;

WHEREAS, Section 16 of RA 7611, provides that the governance, implementation and policy direction of the SEP shall be exercised by the Palawan Council for Sustainable Development, hereinafter referred to as the Council.

WHEREAS, Sections 4 and 6 of R.A. 7611 specified that SEP shall serve as framework to guide government instrumentalities and other agencies concerned and to aligned formulation and implementation of plans, programs and projects affecting the environment and natural resources of Palawan with that of the Council;

WHEREAS, the Palawan Cement Mining and Industrial Corporation and its associates seek approval of its cement project from the Council on its 45th regular meeting in Puerto Princesa City held on October 11, 1996 and a follow on deliberation during the PCSD's special meeting on November 15, 1996 in Quezon City and presented its programs therefore;

NOW ,THEREFORE, on motion of Congressman Abueg, duly seconded by Congressman Sandoval;


RESOLVED, as it is hereby RESOLVED, that the Council approved the establishment of a cement plant, quarrying and other facilities in the municipalities of Quezon and Espanola, Palawan by Central Palawan Mining and Industrial Corporation, Fenway Resources Ltd. of Canada and Associated Strategic Investors, and Strategic Alliance Development Corp./P.T. Citra Group of Indonesia, and its associates, subject to the submission of the Environmental Impact Assessment within 60 days from receipt hereof;

RESOLVED FURTHER, that pursuant to Sections 4 and 6 of R.A. 7611, the the Department of Environment and Natural Resources is hereby authorized to issue the necessary Certificate of Environmental Clearance;


RESOLVED FINALLY, that copies be provided to the Secretary of the Department of Environment and Natural Resources, the proponents, and other government and non-government agencies concerned;
